# Camping with care



# What to do

- 1 Camp 20m from water to protect riverbanks.
- 2 Ensure you source your firewood legally.
- 3 Clean dishes in a bucket and keep showers and toilets away from waterways.
- 4 Put water on fire until it's cool to touch.
- 5 Bag and recycle glass and cans and collect sharp items.
- 6 Take all rubbish home with you.



## Going camping? Protect Victoria's forests

# Why?

- 1 Camping close to water damages riverbanks.
- 2 Collecting firewood illegally can damage wildlife habitat and ecosystems.
- 3 Soap and wastewater in rivers pollutes waterways.
- 4 Unattended campfires can cause bushfires.
- 5 Broken glass and cans can cause injury.
- 6 There are no rubbish services and leaving rubbish can make animals sick.

### IMPORTANT

It is your legal responsibility to:

- camp 20m from water
- set up portable showers/ toilets 50m from water
- Bury human faeces 100m from water
- Ensure campfires are completely extinguished with water and cool to touch before you leave.

It is illegal to litter, use soap in rivers, and cut down trees or bushes. Penalties may apply for non-compliance.
